

School Uniform Policy

From June 2004 the wearing of the school uniform was made compulsory and it was started that the wearing of the uniform would be strictly enforced.

The school uniform is very important for the image of the school and enhances your child's association with S.N. Fhionnghlaise. It also relieves parents of the expenses of having to keep up – to - date with school fashions!

The school uniform is as follows:

Girls: Royal Blue V-Neck Jumper or Cardigan
Light Blue Shirt Blue School Tie
Grey Skirt/Pinafore/Trousers
Grey Socks or Tights.

Boys: Royal Blue V-Neck Jumper
Light Blue Shirt Blue School Tie
Grey Trousers

- We would ask that the girls wear their skirts at knee length.
- **Shirts** to be worn with jumpers / **not** polo shirts. Ties to be worn with shirts for both boys and girls.
- A uniform tracksuit was also introduced in 2004 and is navy with a blue school crest and blue polo shirt.
- The children wear their tracksuit on P.E. Days only which will be advised by the teacher.
- **Football shirts are not allowed under the uniform.** If your child is cold we would suggest a plain white t-shirt. No body warmers/polo necks allowed.
- A child can only wear the correct school uniform when supported by his/her parent. In exceptional circumstances please send a note to the class teacher explaining the reason(s) for non-uniform.
- Please ensure that your child wears safe footwear.
- The only jewellery allowed is a watch and stud earrings. Please leave all rings, bracelets, chains and hoop, longer earrings at home. It would be safer if children did **not** wear jewellery on P.E. days.
- Please put your child's name on his / her belongings. It is much easier for the teachers to trace lost belongings that are named.
- If a child continues to break the uniform rules a note will be sent home to the parent and he/she will be invited to discuss the problem with the Principal.
